As for its contribution to our energy picture, natural gas is cleaner-burning than oil, but the process of converting it to liquid, transporting it in tankers and then regasifying it produces a much dirtier-burning fuel than oil, emitting up to 20% more carbon. That's exactly what we don't need right now, especially since this is foreign gas and we have no shortage of domestic natural gas. The only ones who will profit from this project are Atlantic Sea Island Group corporation, its lobbyists, and backers. The overwhelming citizen response is a resounding: NO!
